## **APPROVAL OF MINUTES – JUNE 3, 2011 MEETING**

**Dr. Lupo** moved and **Mr. Ryan** seconded that the minutes of the June 3, 2011 ONCC meeting be approved. The motion was approved by unanimous voice vote.

## **REPORT OF THE CITY OF CHICAGO DEPARTMENT OF AVIATION – CHIEF OPERATING OFFICER KHALED NAJA, FOR COMMISSIONER ROSEMARIE S. ANDOLINO**

### **A. May - June 2011 ANMS Reports**

Mr. Jackson reviewed the May 2011 ANMS Report, which showed that the most-used departure runway was 32L at 27%; the most-used arrival runway was 10 at 29%. Complaint calls totaled 1,192 calls from 372 callers. A total of 2,313 operations were reported for May 2011.

Mr. Jackson also reviewed the June 2011 ANMS Report, which showed that the most-used departure runway was 32L at 33%; the most-used arrival runway was 10 at 24%. Complaint calls totaled 1,340 calls from 579 callers. A total of 2,449 operations were reported for June 2011.

## **REPORT OF THE COMMISSION CHAIRPERSON – ONCC Vice Chairperson**

**Dr. Raymond J. Kuper, for Mayor Arlene J. Mulder**

### **A. Nighttime Operations on Runway 9L/27R – FAA Letter for May - July 2011**

Dr. Kuper referenced correspondence from the Federal Aviation Administration (FAA) regarding the nighttime operations on Runway 9L/27R between 10:00 P.M. and 6 A.M. During May 2011, no nighttime operations occurred. In June, weather and operational issues required that 27 Right be used for three arrivals on June 10, 2011 and six arrivals on June 17, 2011. July's overnight usage was limited to the FAA's Flight Inspection Aircraft using Runway 27 Left.

### **B. City of Chicago Ward Representation**

Dr. Kuper reported that ONCC members approved the amendment to the Intergovernmental Agreement allowing for a representative from each of the five most impacted wards in the City of Chicago to serve on the ONCC. Chicago Mayor Rahm Emanuel made the following appointments: Mr. Ron Sak – 36<sup>th</sup> Ward; Diane Opplinger – 38<sup>th</sup> Ward; Andrew S. Ginocchio – 39<sup>th</sup> Ward; Catherine Dunlap – 41<sup>st</sup> Ward and Dr. Donald Walsh – 45<sup>th</sup> Ward.

## **COMMITTEE REPORTS**

### **School Sound Insulation Committee Report – Dr. Raymond J. Kuper, ONCC School Sound Insulation Committee Chairperson,**

Dr. Kuper reported that the School committee met on May 9, 2011. The Committee received an update from Lindsay Guttilla of the FAA. The most current news was that the Ridgewood bid results were reported back to FAA officials in Washington, DC and she received the green light to prepare all the necessary paperwork. Subsequently, the grant was awarded and construction has begun.

Elk Grove High School has completed their construction plans and went out for bids in July 2011. Senator Durbin's Office announced that the construction grant was approved. The first phase of construction will begin shortly and will be focused on roof work that will not interrupt school operations. The second phase of construction will begin next summer and focus on installation of windows, curtain walls, roofing, HVAC and interior sound mitigation. Substantial completion is scheduled for the third week of August, 2012.

The School Sound Insulation Committee authorized testing of St. Tarcissus to be completed this summer. That testing has been completed and results will be presented at the next School Sound Insulation Committee on September 12, 2011.

## **ONCC Technical Committee Report – Mr. Joseph Annunzio, ONCC Technical Committee Chairperson**

Mr. Annunzio reported that the Technical Committee met on Tuesday, August 23, 2011. The Committee reviewed the 2<sup>nd</sup> Quarter 2011 Fly Quiet Report. The report showed that arrivals on Runway 10 were 34% of all flights between 10:00 PM and 7:00 AM. At the other end of the Runway – Arrivals on 28 were 23% of arrivals. Runway 32 Left continues to be the primary departure runway at 40% of overnight flights. The second busiest departure runway during that time period was 22 Left with 19% of departures. Adherence to the preferred flight paths improved on every runway when compared to the second quarter of 2010.

Mr. Jackson reported that the Itasca Long-Term Portable Noise Monitor for April 2011 was 63.7 DNL. He also reported that the monitor was relocated onto public property in late July. Noise monitor site 6 in Chicago's Ward 41 was removed over the Summer due to new ownership of the private property where the monitor was located. Staff is currently working to find a new location for site 6.

The next meeting will be held on September 27, 2011 at the Mount Prospect Village Hall.

## **Residential Sound Insulation Committee Report – Mr. Frank A. Damato, ONCC Residential Sound Insulation Committee Chairperson**

Mr. Damato reported that the 2009 Program homeowner briefings were held and there are 977 homes enrolled. Seventy-six percent of home inventories are completed and ninety-five percent of Schiller Park alternates' homes have enrolled with twenty three remaining. A bid package will be announced in November of 2011. Status letters were mailed to all 2009 Program participants in late August. The next status letters are scheduled to be mailed in six months.

Mr. Damato indicated there are 1,000 dwelling units plus alternates allocated for the 2010 Program Year. A status letter was sent to homeowners in the 2010 program area advising them they will be invited to an informational briefing in the 2<sup>nd</sup> Quarter of 2012. The Program staff will send additional status letters for this Program Year in February of 2012.

The next Residential Committee Meeting will take place on Wednesday, September 21, 2011, at the Norridge Village Hall at 9:30 A.M.
