## **REPORT OF THE CITY OF CHICAGO DEPARTMENT OF AVIATION – AMY MALICK, DEPUTY COMMISSIONER, CHICAGO DEPARTMENT OF AVIATION**

### **July 2013 ANMS Report**

Mr. Jeffrey Jackson reviewed the July 2013 Airport Noise Management System report that showed Runway 32L was the most-used departure runway at 37%; Runway 27L was the most-used arrival runway at 21%. Complaint calls totaled 2,280 from 616 complainants. A total of 2,529 operations were reported in July 2013. He said of the 616 complainants, 202 complaints were made during the nighttime hours for July 2013.

## **B. ONCC Governance Committee**

Ms. Mulder reported that at the ONCC's annual retreat in August 2013 participants discussed the need for ONCC By-Laws to be reviewed and updated. She said that there will be an ONCC Governance Committee meeting in the fall 2013. The committee's recommendations will be reviewed by the ONCC Executive Committee and then presented to the full commission in the beginning of 2014.

## **C. Congressman Mike Quigley Meeting – September 3, 2013**

Ms. Mulder reported that Congressman Mike Quigley invited several state senators and representatives, Chicago aldermen, suburban mayors, FAA and CDA leaders and citizens represented by the FAIR Group to a meeting held at the Chicago Department of Aviation. This meeting provided an opportunity to communicate with the people who will be impacted by the new runway commissioning on October 17, 2013.

Congressman Quigley requested a follow-up meeting soon to keep the dialog continuing during the airport modernization. FAA Great Lakes Administrator Barry Cooper and CDA Commissioner Rosemarie Andolino reiterated to the group that both the CDA and FAA conducted due diligence in 2005 and Runway 10C/28C will be commissioned on October 17, 2013. Arrivals and departures will use runways in an East and West Flow. Runway 10R/28L and the South Air Traffic Control Tower will open in 2015. The FAA stressed it tries to be a good source of information and posts all inquiries and answers on the FAA website. The FAA also reminded participants that a study is underway regarding 65DNL and they are in discussions with Congresswoman Jan Schakowsky's office.

At the meeting, Chicago Alderman Mike Zalewski, who serves as Chairman of the Committee on Aviation for the Chicago City Council, announced Alderman Mary O'Connor (41<sup>st</sup> ward) has been appointed vice chair of this committee.

Ms. Mulder recognized that the citizens from FAIR and other suburban communities are organizing and distributing information to residents. She stressed that ONCC works very hard to be a good source of information from all aviation stakeholders and a forum for communities. She reminded everyone that the ONCC will continue seek answers and be good neighbors.

## **D. 2014 ONCC Budget Committee Formation**

Ms. Mulder reported that ONCC Executive Director Jeanette Camacho will be reaching out to members to serve on the 2014 Budget Ad Hoc Committee.

## **COMMITTEE REPORTS**

### **School Sound Insulation Committee Report – Dr. Raymond J. Kuper, School Sound Insulation Committee Chairperson**

Dr. Kuper reported that last week the FAA released a \$375,000 design grant to Chicago Public School District 299. Ebinger Elementary School is the recipient of this grant and the last designated school to receive sound insulation in preparation of the OMP full-build-out noise contour.

The School Sound Insulation Committee will meet on Tuesday, October 22, 2013 at 10:00 a.m. at Ridgewood High School.

### **ONCC Technical Committee Report – Mr. Joseph Annunzio, Technical Committee Chairperson**

Mr. Annunzio reported that the ONCC Technical Committee met on August 13, 2013. He thanked Mr. Dennis Ryan for chairing the meeting.

The Committee welcomed special guest speaker Mangala Lonkar, Boeing Commercial Airplane Manager—Noise and Emissions. Ms. Lonkar described Boeing's efforts to work with air traffic control, airlines, airports and community groups to develop sustainable solutions for quieter and cleaner skies. The 737-800 has a 50 percent smaller noise footprint and a 27 percent lower CO2 footprint per seat than the MD80s. She told the committee that the 787 is 28 percent below the 2008 industry standard for noise and has a 60 percent smaller footprint than the MD-80s. The committee thanked Ms. Lonkar and Boeing for their time and expertise.

Chairman Annunzio said the Technical Committee gained a better understanding of how far the industry has come and where aviation is going in relationship to noise and emissions.

The Committee also reviewed the 2<sup>nd</sup> Quarter Fly Quiet Report and the April ANMS report. Also the updated Introduction to Noise and Aviation and Noise: Glossary of Terms and Acronyms documents were presented.

On August 29, 2013, Jeanette Camacho and Aaron Frame escorted several ONCC members and representatives from Congressman Quigley's office on a tour of the Chicago Air Route Traffic Control Center in Aurora. This regional air traffic control facility

manages midwest flights before and after TRACON guides aircraft in and out of O'Hare. In addition to observing controllers on the job, participants viewed a typical day in U.S. airspace and witnessed last year's Super Bowl event through the eyes of air traffic control via time lapse screens. This amazing "highway in the sky" captured aircraft in route to and from the Indianapolis airport.

The next Technical Committee will be held on September 10, 2013 at 9 a.m. at Mount Prospect Village Hall.

### **Residential Sound Insulation Committee Report – Mr. Frank A. Damato, Residential Chairperson**

Mr. Damato reported that Homeowner briefings were held in late 2012 and in January of this year. Contracts for Bid Packages 4 and 5 were awarded for a total of 374 homes. Field measurements are scheduled to begin later this month.

The City of Chicago rejected Bid Packages 1, 2 and 3 and is re-bidding the work for these homes. Those contracts will be advertised in the 4<sup>th</sup> quarter of 2013. The FAA and the State Historical Preservation Office have reviewed the proposed sound insulation treatments for the two historical homes in Phase 16. Meetings will be scheduled with the owners of the historical homes this month to review the sound insulation treatments. Bid Package 6 includes 23 regular homes and 2 historical homes, and will be advertised for bids in the 1<sup>st</sup> quarter of 2014. Construction will be complete on all Phase 16 homes by the 4<sup>th</sup> quarter of 2014.

The City of Chicago is in planning stages for the Phase 17 homes.

The next Residential Committee meeting will be on September 18, 2013.

## **REPORT OF THE EXECUTIVE DIRECTOR – MS. JEANETTE CAMACHO**

### **A. June – August 2013 Financial Statements**

Ms. Camacho reported expenses totaled \$ 22,480.19 for the month of June, \$12,121.40 for July 2013 and \$12,578.68 for August 2013.
