



**APPROVED MEETING MINUTES OF JANUARY 15, 2004
MEETING OF THE O'HARE NOISE COMPATIBILITY COMMISSION
RESIDENTIAL SOUND INSULATION COMMITTEE**

The meeting of the O'Hare Noise Compatibility Commission Residential Sound Insulation Committee was held on January 15, 2014, at the Norridge Village Hall, 4000 N. Olcott, Norridge IL.

Vice Chairman Judith Dunne Bernardi called the meeting to order at 9:33 a.m. ONCC staff took the meeting minutes.

There being a majority of Committee members in attendance, a quorum was present for the transaction of business.

APPROVAL OF MEETING MINUTES–NOVEMBER 20, 2013 MEETING

There was a motion made by Trustee Ridder to approve the November 20, 2013 meeting minutes. Ms. Bernardi seconded the motion. The meeting minutes were approved by unanimous voice vote.

PHASE 16 O'HARE RESIDENTIAL SOUND INSULATION PROGRAM

Ms Williams reported that there are just over 1,000 homes in Phase 16; there are currently 1,009 homes signed up. Home inventories are complete on 99% of those homes. Three construction contracts were re-bid 2 were awarded in December 2013. Notices to proceed were given to 2 contracts and are waiting for the third contract to proceed. She said that there are 26 more homes to be bid out which include the historical pilot program.

Ms. Williams said that as of January 2014, 10,000 homes have been sound insulated since the beginning of the program.

PHASE 17 O'HARE RESIDENTIAL SOUND INSULATION PROGRAM

Mr. Frame reported that Phases 17A and 17B will have homes located Chicago and Park Ridge. The planning phase has been completed. He noted that these homes are the last homes that were identified as part of OMP's construction of Runway 9C/27C. Phase 17C will include the remainder of Chicago homes which include the historical district located in Chicago Ward 41 and consists of approximately 270 homes.

Ms. Dunlap thanked staff for working in meetings with the Norwood Park Historical Society and the Norwood Park Chamber of Commerce and the Alderman and her staff in selecting a mason construction home for a pilot project on historic home insulation. The pilot home work would be timed with work in Phase 16.

Mr. Frame reported that Phase 17 is in the planning design phase. Phase 17A will be the first phase to proceed with sound insulation.

OTHER BUSINESS

Next ONCC Residential Sound Insulation Committee Meeting – MARCH 18, 2014

Ms. Bernardi informed members that the next meeting will be held on March 18, 2014 at the Norridge Village Hall.

COMMENTS FROM THE MEMBERS

No comments were made by members.

COMMENTS FROM THE AUDIENCE

Mr. McGoven, a Wood Dale resident, asked when his home will be sound insulated.

Mr. and Mrs. Beban, Norridge residents, complained of excessive aircraft noise over their home. They would like to have their home sound insulated.

Mr. Frame explained the ONCC, CDA and FAA held several community open houses that included one in Norridge. At the open houses, residents were able to see maps and ask questions regarding the opening of Runway 10C/28C which was commissioned in October 2013. He explained that the OMP was approved over 8 years ago by the FAA. He explained that upon full build out of the OMP scheduled for 2020, there will be another contour created looking 5 years into the future.

Mr. Catalano, a Chicago resident, complained of low flying aircraft. He noted that a school about 1 block away was sound insulated and didn't understand why his home isn't eligible for sound insulation.

Mr. Frame explained the criteria for school sound insulation is different from residential sound insulation.

Mr. Kezios, a Norridge resident, asked for the projection of the new runways over his community.

Mr. Frame pointed out in the lobby of the Norridge Village Hall, there was a poster board with a map of Norridge showing flight patterns over Norridge.

Mr. Hinsberger, a Chicago resident, encouraged the audience to complain to congressmen in their area regarding aircraft noise.

MEETING ADJOURNMENT

A motion to adjourn the meeting was made by Mr. Sak and seconded by Trustee Ridder. The motion passed by unanimous voice vote. The meeting adjourned at 10:23 a.m.
